Abstract

Finance has achieved a high reputation as an academic discipline in the last decades: more than fifteen Nobel awards bear witness to it. There is hardly any other field in social sciences with similar relevance for practical decision making. Nevertheless, modern Finance is grounded on quite poor foundations: Portfolio Theory, the famous CAPM, the widespread techniques of option pricing, etc. All these ideas are based on the concept that Financial Analysis has been done successfully.

But, do we really know what that means? Till now the most important, the most time consuming, and by far the best paid jobs in the financial industry have not been in the attention of academic textbooks. In his talk Prof. Dr. *Klaus Schredelseker* will argue why the often neglected foundations of Finance are worth considering.

Speaker

Prof. Dr. Klaus Schredelseker (1943) studied Economics, Business Administration and Law in Paris, Mannheim, Berlin, Milano, and Munich, where he got his PhD in Business Administration. At first he was professor in financial economics at Wuppertal and since 1986 in Innsbruck, where he retired in 2011. His research interests have always been in corporate governance, in law and economics, in financial markets, and in information economics. He was visiting professor in Poznan, Strasbourg, Siena, Trento, Potsdam, Firenze, and cofounder of the Free University of Bolzano (Italy). 1996/97 he was president of the European Financial Management Association.
