1. Application for Admission

Students should apply through the office in charge of International Exchange at their home university. Submitted application materials with a formal nomination letter will be sent by the office in charge of International Exchange to the Director of the International Center, Chung-Ang University.

3. Acceptance and Visa Procedures

Admission decisions will be made within 4 weeks of receiving the application. The acceptance letter with the Certificate of Admission will be sent to the Office in charge of International Exchanges. Students should submit the Certificate of Admission and other required documents to the Korean Embassy for the obtainment of a student visa (D-2).

4. Arrival Date

Exchange students for the 2013 academic year are expected to arrive during the last weekend of August 2013 for the Fall semester. Students who arrive earlier than the official move-in date of the University Housing will need to arrange their own accommodation for the additional stays.

We will inform you of the exact move-in dates when we send your acceptance letter.

5. Our Academic Year

The academic year at our university consists of a spring and fall semester. The spring semester begins March 1st and ends in 3rd week of June. The fall semester begins September 1st and ends in the 3rd week of December. Between the two semesters, we have summer and winter vacations that are each two months in length.
